I almost don't know where to start, there are so many, but let's take a look at something perhaps relatively simple but something that can have a potentially important effect on how you work on your PC. OK, so what can you do with your mouse? There are numerous brands and types with some of their own features, but I will try and just deal with some of the basics...

Well, first off, for those of you like me who are left-handed, how about changing it so you can use it with your left hand? You can change the settings so that the mouse clicks are reversed (for those of you using MACs, I guess you don't have to deal with this...). At one point in my life, I used my mouse right-handed like most of the world, until I started to get pains in my right hand and elbow. I will make a long story short, but I wound up having surgery on my right elbow in 2001, so I had no choice at the time but to re-program my mouse.

You can also change the sensitivity of the mouse, so a little movement on your part can be a greater and faster motion on your screen. Some even have the capability of placing your cursor over the default setting when you are at a screen requiring a response. Be careful with this, because you might not want the default but, if you inadvertently click or press Enter, you will get it.

Most mouse drivers come with different types, sizes, colors, etc. of cursors. There are often "schemes" or "motifs" if you will, so all the cursors you see have something in common. Be aware that if you want to go with the fancy animated ones, though, you may be sacrificing some processing power.

OK, that pretty much covers the basics. You might want to check out your mouse's capabilities at some time and see if it helps you make your time in front of your PC a little less tedious.
